Getting to Know Our Residents By Marvin Bauer

I grew up on a small farm in northwest Indiana. By high school, I knew I wanted a career in agriculture. In Indiana, that meant Purdue University where a class in agronomy and an opportunity to work as an undergraduate research assistant with an agronomy professor and his graduate

students led to an M.S. degree and then a Ph.D. at the University of Illinois. While at Illinois I met my wife, Jean, a high school home economics teacher in my hometown. With M.S. and Ph.D. degrees in family resource management and economics, she later became an Extension specialist at Burdue.

Extension specialist at Purdue.

As I was finishing my degree at Illinois, the Laboratory for Applications of Remote Sensing (LARS) at Purdue, a pioneer in developing computer classification of digital imagery for mapping and analysis of land and natural resources, offered me a position for crop inventory research. The potential to apply crop ecology to an emerging field and be part of major projects with NASA and USDA to estimate crop production was too good to turn down. In 1980 I was invited to become editor-inchief of the Remote Sensing of Environment journal. I thought I might do it for three or four years, but as it grew and became the leading journal, colleagues encouraged me not to stop and I continued for 34 years. In 1983, we were selected for two faculty positions in our areas at the University of Minnesota. I expanded my research to include forest inventory, mapping impervious surface areas, and monitoring water quality of lakes. Jean was recognized for her leadership of a 17-state project on Rural Families and Work, and faculty governance, culminating as chair of the faculty consultative committee. In short, the U of M and Minnesota have been great. We had 43 wonderful years together, enjoying our families, church, gardening, and travel, as well as our research and teaching.

I am now retired but continue to help with research on monitoring lake water quality. With current sensors and models, the internet, and supercomputers, we can monitor Minnesota's 10,000 lakes for analysis of geographic and temporal changes and management by resource agencies. What we could only dream of 50 years ago, when I started, is indeed coming to fruition.

Last but not least, is Trillium Woods. It is great in every way. One of my New Year's resolutions is to really retire and spend more time taking advantage of its activities and programs with friends and neighbors here.

Audubon's Rowe Sanctuary's Sandhill Crane Cam Monday, April 1 and Tuesday, April 2 7:45 PM - 8:45 PM

Tune in for one of natures most spectacular viewing events of the season. The sandhill cranes migrate from southern states and stop along the Platte River in Nebraska to rest and refuel. This camera covers a five-mile stretch in one of the most densely populated roosts in the world, with 100,000 -200,000 cranes at the height of migration. They return from feeding around sunset (8:01 PM) to spend the night on the river's shallow sandbars. Let's hope they don't leave for the northern states early this year due to warm weather.
