
A Three-Front Pacific War, January-May 1944

Musings From YOUR RESIDENT COUNCIL

WELCOME JOE: Council had a meet and greet with Joe Amend-Marshall, our new Executive Director, on June 14. As he said later in his meeting with all residents on June 16, he is excited about being here and working with all of us to keep Trillium Woods as the foremost senior community in the state.

REMEMBERING: At our rescheduled June 20 meeting, Council observed a moment of silence, remembering those residents who had died since our May meeting: Renner Johnston, an orthopedic surgeon, and lover of loons; Fritz Drill another orthopedic surgeon and teacher; Margaret Andrus, the first Trillium Woods resident; Ken Barrera, a foundational pillar and treasurer of the Association; and Dan McAlpine, with his winning smile. In the **REFLECTION** time, Dick Willits shared a delightful poem about living life "inside out."

VISITORS - **REMINDER:** We welcomed several visitors. Council meetings are generally open, but we have asked that if you wish to attend you **notify me** (or Rita) **well ahead of time**, so we have time to arrange for seating.

FINANCES: Dennis Kudelka, Interim Finance Committee chair, presented the May 31 Association Financial Statements, noting the few transactions during the month. The Association's finances remain healthy. He reminded Committee Chairs to submit budgets for the 2023-2024 Association Fiscal Year, which begins July 1.

NOTES from the EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR and ADMINISTRATOR: With Joe at an LCS Orientation Conference and Matt Phipps away, Sam Paider, Administrator, reported to Council for both positions on June 20. Notably, Building 5 deposits are very close to the needed 36 for financing purposes, and the LCS Development Team and Architects are nearing final details, hoping to present these to residents later this summer. The expansion received some television and business publication coverage. The Birches is operating at very close to budgeted occupancy, with some 35 Trillium Woods residents receiving short-term or long-term care. The Birches' team has made great strides in recruiting staff, thus reducing reliance on outside contract staff. Sam urged us to thank our CNAs this week. She also commented on the flooring and painting updates in The Birches.

ASSOCIATE APPRECIATION FUND TASK FORCE: Council met in executive session to receive the Report from Task Force Chair, Rolf Bjelland. We had a good discussion, but did not make any decisions, preferring instead to make the report available to all residents and to hold a listening session open to all residents, giving all a chance to ask questions and make comments, before Council makes the final decisions on the process for the Appreciation Fund 2023 Campaign. Details will be forthcoming.

THE COMMITTEE's CORNER: The Library Committee is chaired by Jane Johnston. Its mission is to manage library operations, including acquiring books, receiving book donations, selecting books to keep, donating surplus books to local charities, and organizing book displays throughout the Trillium Woods campus. It operates on the honor system – if you take a book out to read, please return it as promptly as possible. It has a budget for acquiring new books – Jane asks that you return the hardback books with the dust cover. For more information about this committee, contact Jane.

- **Scholarship Committee:** Scholarship America, Inc. is reviewing the applications, and the committee hopes to be able to announce awards in the near future.


Springbrook Nature Center Monday, July 17 Depart: 1:00 PM Return: 3:00 PM




July Book Club Selection Carolina Moonset Author: Matt Goldman Tuesday, July 18
