For most of us, the word "extinction" conjures images of an enormous asteroid and the destruction of dinosaurs 66 million years ago. But in reality, entire species of animals and plants are still disappearing from the earth each year.

Just how bad is this decline in biodiversity? According to the International Union for Conservation of Nature's (IUCN) "Red List" of Threatened Species, 47,000–or 28%–of our 169,000 known species (including mammals, birds, fish, trees, corals and more) are in danger of extinction. 
