Great Decisions: Economic Warfare

Speaker: Richard Leitch

Waging economic warfare consists of a variety of measures from implementing sanctions to instigating labor strikes. Such tools are utilized by states to hinder their enemies, and in the case of the United States, have been used as far back as the early 19th century. Since Russia invaded Ukraine in February 2022, economic warfare has been the main means for the west to challenge Russia. How effective will these sanctions be at convincing Russia to cease its war? Dr. Richard Leitch earned his BA in East Asian Studies from Colby College in 1985, and went on to earn an MA in Asian Studies from the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign after a two year career on Wall Street. He has been a member of the Political Science Department at Gustavus since 1996 and his research interests include Japanese domestic politics and foreign policy, and he is the co-author of "Japan's Role in the Post-Cold War World."

Musings From YOUR RESIDENT COUNCIL

COUNCIL MET April 10, with Vice President Dick Willits stepping in as chair while Jim was tending to Liza's new adventure. Many thanks to Dick. This report is from draft minutes.

REMEMBERING: At that meeting, Council observed a moment of silence, remembering the passing of both Betsy Ellgren and Kenny Hannay, as well as concern for our Council colleagues Judy and Ken. In the **REFLECTION** time, Norm Schmitz quoted a favorite Bible passage, reminding us that as our body gets older and weaker, our spirit grows anew every day.

NOTES from the EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR and ADMINISTRATOR: Matt Phipps said that with lower CoVID rates, some LCS communities are adjusting their CoVID communication procedures. Council recommended that we continue with both hard copy and Touchtown updates. Similarly, some communities are relaxing vaccination requirements. Matt said Trillium Woods has retained its policy but will work with the LCS Medical Advisory Board and other sources as we evaluate that going forward. By the time this *Musings* report is printed, residents will have received notice of the contract with Northern Lights Health as the provider to replace LifeSpark. Similarly, the community will have heard and seen the update on Building 5 from LCS Development. Matt added a reminder of the Scholarship Fund opportunities for associates and eligible dependents. The application window is open until May 1. Sam Paider announced the Volunteer Program has been reinstated, and another orientation session will be scheduled for those who wish to assist in organized activities at The Birches.

THE COMMITTEE'S CORNER: Notwithstanding the recent snowy blasts, Spring will come, and landscaping will become a focus. Dennis Kudelka, chair, reports:

The members of the Landscape Committee support Brian Tryke, Maintenance Supervisor, who manages the outside service organization responsible for lawn and landscape maintenance for the Trillium Woods campus. One of the first Spring tasks is to provide flower selection input for the planters that decorate the campus. The Committee also helps to evaluate Trillium Woods current landscaping, consolidate resident input, and develop recommendations for improvements. You can contact members of the Committee with questions or concerns. If you have or observe specific Landscape issues such as a shrub outside your apartment that needs pruning, a tree that is hitting your window, or a lawn sprinkler head that is broken please submit a Request for Landscaping Service using WorxHub in Touchtown or ask the front desk to submit the Request.

OTHER NEWS OF NOTE:

- Dennis Kudelka has been appointed Interim Chair of the Finance Committee, serving while our Treasurer, Ken Barrera, takes what we hope is a short leave of absence from that duty.
- Norm Schmitz reports for Facilities Committee that grab bars will be installed in the bathrooms near the Auditorium. And that ADA door openers will be installed in the trash rooms.
- Council expressed concern about the safety issues caused by the proliferation of scooters and walkers in the 2nd floor Coat Room during the dinner hours.







The Bookwoman of Troublesome Creek


